Grants to Businesses and Charitable and Social Organisations within the Parish of Stillington

Stillington Community Association Ltd was formed in 2003. We have established a solid, thriving business and we have paid off the bank loan used to purchase the original Post Office and shop. As a 'not for profit' organisation, we are obliged to make good use of any 'surplus funds'.

Subject to approval by shareholders at the AGM we have a modest amount of money surplus to requirements to give as financial grants to businesses and charitable and social organisations within the Parish of Stillington. Qualifying grants will generally be for capital expenditure, rather than to support the on-going running costs of an organisation.

Stillington Community Association Ltd is bound by its Rules, of which Rule 3, the Objects of the Association states:

1. The objects of the Association shall be for the benefit of the community represented by the Association referred to a Rule 2 to sustain, encourage, provide, facilitate or resuscitate village retail enterprises and in particular shops, public houses and garages, including the acquisition of land, construction, improvement, alteration or adapting of buildings or dwelling houses and any other functions ancillary, supplemental or incidental to such objectives. Further the Association may provide financial grants to other non-profit making village and community organisations for social or charitable purposes.

Applications will then be considered by the Grants Subcommittee of the Board, which includes two Independent Advisers. The proposed Grants will be voted on at the AGM as a block and the successful applicants will be informed. Those receiving grants will be asked to supply reports to the Board showing evidence of how the grant has been spent. The Boards decision is final.
